





NETWORK →

- Produce guidelines/protocols/etc for analysis, collections, sampling, contextual data
- Collect, store, ship, analyse samples (starting by a Proof of Concept)
- Manage databases joining ecotoxicological results; sample id+basic data; individual contextual data; population contextual data

ERBF AMBASSADORS WHAT SHOULD THEY BE?

- Coordinating and pivotal figures widespread throughout Europe
- Contact points and facilitators
- People with a lot of energy/motivation
- People with very good will, resilience and patience
- People capable of contacting many actors regionally or nationally

Consensual people – harmonizers; providing confidence to participants

(Representatives/delegates for countries/regions – there could be more than 1 per country) \rightarrow members of a management committee

ERBF AMBASSADORS Some valuable skills – how to choose?

 Be aware of the ongoing national monitoring schemes and the main groups involved

- Interest on establishing regular contacts with national/regional actors
- Have good capacity of organization and coordination
- Have interest in the monitoring of contaminants in raptors and motivation in participating in ERBioMS

 Have the capacity to receive and pass information between the network actors in order to provide feedback on the results of the ERBioMS.

– Have storage capacity for samples at least for a short-term

ERBF AMBASSADORS WHO CAN THEY BE?

- (a) Environmental Specimen Banks (ESB),
- (b) Natural History Museums (NHM),
- (c) Ecotoxicology research institutions,
- (d) Ecology research institutions,
- (e) Wildlife Rehabilitation Centres (WRC),
- (f) Environmental NGO's

The suitability can depend mostly on the will to assume the commitment and responsibility, and the motivation to participate in the ERBFacility

ERBF AMBASSADORS WHAT COULD THEY DO?

- Collect samples or contextual data; ship, store samples; analyse samples; analyse data
- Look for and motivate relevant actors/participants nationally/regionally (inform the network about ongoing projects in the region/country)
- Circulate information, guidelines, protocols, good-practices to participants
- Inform actors about preferable routes for circulation of samples
- Have the capacity to store samples (even if for short periods)
- Store contextual data and centralize a national/regional database
- Centralize questions about ERBFacility advise for national legislation
- Establish contacts with local authorities
- Look for funding opportunities at a regional/national level
- Contact with regional/national media

- Proof of concept
- STSMs + COST-Action deliverables
- Future ERBFacility
